May purchase new equipment in the spring once storage situation improves. Q: Why wasn't there a gymnastics team? A: need a trained staff volunteer and don't have one. We also don't have the equipment. Q: Could a trained parent volunteer? A: Would have to check, also would need to ensure proper equipment (e.g., mats). Q: How are badminton teams being chosen without tryouts? A: They begin playing in class, then gym teachers select students with passion and/or skill to suggest for the team.
